Under the webinar, the question paper format and concepts based on class IX and X board exam for session 2026 were discussed in detail.

Skill development with curriculum: -

Principal, Mr. Manoj Kothekar went to Indore as a resource person at Sri Sri Ravishankar Vidya Mandir, Indore on 9th June , 2025. He took workshop of teachers on the topic “Skill development with curriculum”

Orientation session: -

After the school reopening, Principal took Orientation session for all teachers on 11th June, where he told the general rules for all teachers to be followed like punctuality, uniform, leave rules (Medical and Casual leaves), how to apply for leaves, use of Youthconnekt app, various school committees. He also introduced the new teachers who joined the school.

Mental and Physical well-being course by Art of Living: -

Mental and physical well-being course by Art of Living was conducted for teachers from 10th to 14th June, 2025 with the aim of enhancing their mental clarity, emotional resilience, and inner peace.

They attended all the lectures and recorded videos, completed the given assignments and participated in all life skill activities.

Discipline by Design workshop: -

A one day workshop was conducted for teachers on the topic “Discipline by Design” on 18th June, 2025. The resource person was Mrs. Salony Priya from Kolkata. The session started with prayers and introduction of the resource person by Principal. She started by giving her brief introduction and about her foundation. She told what discipline by design means. The teachers need to plan ahead to create a respectful, engaging and structured learning environment. Rather than reacting to the problems after they happen, the teachers should prevent misbehavior through clear expectations, consistency and a positive classroom culture. She conducted one activity in which she made different groups and asked 3 groups to write what are the traditional methods of Discipline and another three about making new methods of discipline. Then each group gave their presentation. She summarized the key points after each presentation. She suggested that the teacher should use classroom rules that describe the behaviors you want instead of listing things that the student cannot do. A teacher should follow 5 P’s in classroom-Prompt, Polite, Prepared, Productive and Persuasive. The session was interactive and engaging and very well received by all the teachers.

Designing Worksheets at Kindergarten Level: -

An online session on the topic-**Designing Worksheets at Kindergarten Level**, for teachers of classes ECCE-Prep to Class V, was conducted by IPN Leadership Academy on 5th July, 2025. The resource person was Mrs. Amutha Edward (Master Trainer- IPN Leadership Academy). She discussed on sub-topics like Key features of a good worksheet, Literacy and Numeracy, Fine Motor skills etc. She also asked teachers to prepare some worksheet and then gave feedback about the worksheets. Overall the session was interesting and useful. The teachers are now making effective worksheets regularly and with much ease.

Effective way to prepare MCQs for assessment: -

An online session on the topic- “Effective way to prepare MCQs for assessment” was conducted on 19th July, 2025 for all teachers. The resource person was Mrs. Chitrakala Ramchandran (Master Trainer- IPN Leadership Academy). She beautifully explained how we can make competency based MCQs. She gave various examples and even asked each one to prepare few question. It was an interactive and engaging session. The session equipped the teachers with the knowledge and skills required to design well-structured, competency-based, and application-oriented MCQs for Computer based test(CBT).

Creative Thinking workshop: -

A Creative Thinking Workshop was conducted at school on 2nd August, 2025. The resource person was Dr. D.N. Sansanwal (Former Head and Dean, Department of Education, DAVV, Indore and Chairman Selection Committee, SSSVV GAIL, Vijaipur). He emphasized the need for innovative approaches in teaching to help students understand concepts more effectively. The session introduced teachers to a variety of interactive techniques and strategies aimed at

improving student involvement and fostering critical thinking. One of the key highlights of the workshop was the introduction to the CORT (Cognitive Research Trust) model of thinking, developed by Edward de Bono, a pioneer in lateral thinking. This model encourages structured thinking and promotes creativity in learning. The facilitator demonstrated various techniques that can be integrated into classroom teaching, such as: PMI (Plus, Minus, Interesting) which is a method to help students explore different aspects of a topic by identifying its positives, negatives, and interesting points. Another technique was CAF (Consider All Factors) to develop comprehensive thinking by considering all elements relevant to a decision or situation. A Rule-making exercise was also done.

Leadership Skill Program: -

Leadership skill program was organized by School of skill education, Tata Institute of Social Science, Mumbai in collaboration with CBSE, Department of Skill development, Ministry of education, Government of India on 18th and 19th August, 2025. It was attended by Mr. Manoj Kotheekar (Principal).

Capacity Building programme on “Financial Market Management”:-

A one day Capacity building programme on FMM was organized by CBSE on 29th July, 2025 at Mahaveer Public school, Jaipur. It was attended by Mr. Roushan Kumar (PGT-Economics). The two resource persons for the programme were Mr. Sajal Chaudhary (Manager-NSE) and Mr. Nikhil Gupta (CFA-Charter Holder). It was well organized and highly interactive.

She discussed on subtopics like -Problem Identification, Data Analysis and Implementation measures etc. Teachers were asked to divide into small groups of 5-6 members in each. They were asked to identify research questions and then to develop a research plan over that. After listening to each group’s plan, the teachers were asked the implementation and Evaluation plan.

CBSE Webinar (Psychological first aid):-

A webinar on “PSYCHOLOGICAL FIRST AID – A MULTIDIMENSIONAL FRAMEWORK FOR PROMOTING MENTAL WELL-BEING IN EDUCATIONAL SETTINGS” was organised by the CBSE on 19th November, 2025. It was attended by Dr. Mily Nautiyal. The session aimed at equipping educators with practical strategies to identify, address, and support the emotional and psychological needs of students in school environments. The resource person for the webinar

was Prof. Daya Pant, former Head of the Department, Educational Psychology and Foundation of Education, NCERT. Prof. Pant. She discussed various dimensions of PFA, including creating a safe environment, active listening, and guiding students towards appropriate coping mechanisms.

DIPLoma COURSE AT DHARMAKSHETRA: -

The 22nd diploma course was conducted by national council of Sri Sathya Sai Schools at Dharamkshetra, Mumbai from 25th December 2025 to 12th January, 2026. The participants from the school were Dr. Mily Nautiyal (PGT-counsellor), Mrs. Snehal Shiralkar (TGT-Mathematics) and Mrs. Praveena Jagdish Nathgosavi (PRT). 11. ENVIRONMENT EDUCATION: -

Swacchata Pakhwada –Painting competition: -

A painting competition on the topic “Cleanliness to Godliness” by GAIL was organised in the school on 11th July, 2025 for the students of classes ECCE-Junior to XII in different categories.

Zero Carbon Initiative in Our School: -

Keeping in view SDG 3,4,6,7,11,13,15 (Sustainable Development Goals) of United Nation, our

school has undertaken a Zero Carbon Initiative with the vision of reducing our Carbon footprint and promoting sustainability. In line with NEP 2020, Environmental Education has been introduced in classes VI–IX to nurture environmental awareness among students. The subject is not limited to theory but is implemented through practical, hands-on activities. Environmental Sustainability Initiatives driven by the 3Rs — “Reduce, Reuse and Recycle” and our school took bold steps for environmental stewardship.

Plantation Drive: -

Over the past three to four years, more than 3,000 plants have been planted and nurtured on the campus by the students through regular plantation drives. Each student has planted at least seven types of plants using different methods of vegetative propagation, focusing mainly on fruit-bearing plants and trees. Under the Seed-to-Tree Programme, students practiced multiple plantation techniques—transforming seeds collected from campus trees into saplings and enriching Sai Upvan with species such as Neem, Ashoka, Sagon, Pentafarm, and Indian Paradise.

This initiative promotes hands-on learning, teamwork, and environmental responsibility, inspiring students to embrace sustainable and eco-friendly practices while fostering a deep connection with nature.

Composting & Vermicomposting: Management of organic waste by producing eco-friendly manure for the school garden.

With three compost pits and a vermicomposting unit, over 5 quintals of manure is produced and used in the school gardens.

Paper Recycling: Collection and reuse of waste paper to minimize deforestation and landfill waste.

We also operate our own Paper Recycling Unit, converting used paper into folders, files, and greeting cards.

Computer-Based Test (CBT) Mode: Transition to digital examinations, significantly reducing paper consumption and saving trees.

- Transitioning to computer-based tests saved over 1,500 sheets of paper per examination.
- This initiative has also reduced the paper cost to ₹15,400 per formative assessment.

Water Recharging: Creation of rainwater harvesting and recharge pits to conserve water resources.

- Through rainwater harvesting and water recycling systems, students learned the value of water conservation.

Culinary Practices:

In alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020; the introduction of culinary practices as a skill subject connected classroom knowledge with real-life applications by engaging students in the complete process — from growing raw ingredients in the school garden to preparing innovative food products.

Using fresh produce from our own garden, students have successfully created items such as mouth freshener, turmeric and ginger pickle, aloe Vera gel, and other natural products. These activities not only enhance students' creativity and practical understanding but also encourage sustainable and healthy living practices.

Community Outreach

- In a heart-warming gesture of service, our students helped construct a school in the nearby village of Kolua Pathar.
- They also initiated sewing classes for women, promoting skill development and empowerment along with teaching the local children.

giving feedback shall be made available during PTMs, which parents may fill and submit to the principal anonymously.

7. It was brought to the notice of the principal that students face difficulties in writing two exams (Olympiads & School based exams) on the same day. The principal agreed to ensure that there should be no such clash.
8. The need of having a safe pucca boundary wall to avoid stray dogs & avoiding the threat of teen-age students jumping the fence was understood by all.
9. Parent body stated that school should allow parents to apply leaves online. School stated that they can send leave application in such cases through email at the email Id. satsaigl@gmail.com and later submit a hard copy for school record.
10. The need of improving spoken English was understood and agreed upon by the school. The school agreed to find out some ways and methods for ensuring improvement in spoken English.
11. The parent representative body suggested to depute one sweeper full time in each block of toilet to ensure hygiene and cleanliness. The school has 10 toilet blocks for around 1000 students and 60 staff members whereas in all 4 sweepers are deployed for total cleanliness of the school. The school agreed to make changes in its system within the available resources.
12. The members wanted reduction in school timings by at least one hour.

The Parent representative body (PRB) was formed to provide constructive feedback to the principal which was agreed upon by the principal on condition that there shall be exclusively parents from all stages ECCE Prep – ECCE Senior, I – II, III – V, VI – VIII, IX – X and XI – XII, at least one from all blocks to ensure meaningful interactions. However, it was observed that there was no representation from I – II and XI – XII. Moreover, it appeared that the GAIL arbitrarily invited union officials in the meeting which is highly detrimental to the spirit of PRB. The meeting ended with Shanti path.

16. SMC DECISIONS (IMPORTANT): -

- 1- While discussing the issue of Medical Insurance, Shri Amar Chandnani brought it to the notice of the members that the medical Insurance of Rs. Two lakhs is also very less and must be increased to 5 Lakhs keeping in view how expensive the treatment has become now a days.
- 2-Four different Video presentation on :- Environmental Excellence achieved by school in implementation of NEP in compliance with Sustainable Developmental Goals(SDGs), Different Trainings attended by teachers, The School Board Results and the overall facilities developed for students for their holistic development by the school were shown.
